Biographical note

Ana Schoebel trained in Conservation and specialised in the textile field after a traineeship at the Abegg Foundation in Bern, Switzerland and the Textile Museum in Lyon, France. For 20 years she worked for the Ministry of Culture at the Fashion Museum and the Spanish Cultural Heritage Institute. In 2008 she was appointed Conservation Manager at the Royal Manufactory of Tapestries. After her return to the Public Administration she was national coordinator of Council of Europe programmes, such as European Heritage Days and European Landscape Convention.
